#### 1. Call to Order

President Norton called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. via a zoom conference call.

#### 2. Roll Call and Determination of a Quorum

#### 3. Pledge of Allegiance

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Director Leen and recited by all.

#### 4. Confirmation of Agenda

#### 5. Comments from the Public

#### 6. Public Hearing

Public hearing was opened at 6:11 p.m. to hear public comments regarding Prop 4 Limits as well as setting the Districts FY 21/22 special tax. The hearing was closed at 6:13 p.m., there were no members of the public present for the hearing.

#### 7. Presentations

Blake from Goranson and Associates, Inc. presented the Glen Ellen Fire District's FY 19/20 audit to the Board. This will be the final audit for Glen Ellen with the consolidation of Valley of the Moon and Mayacamas.

#### 8. Consent Calendar

Board reviewed and approved the special meeting minutes from the board meeting held on June 29, 2021. M/S/P Johnson/Leen with 7 ayes

#### 9. Fire Chief's Monthly Report

Chief Akre gave is monthly report to the Board. A few key items from his report:

- Effective, June 27<sup>th</sup>, Captain Joe Pierson retired from the SVFD. His presence will the Department will be missed.
- Engine 3356 was delivered and now in services. This unit was purchased with minimal funds from the District, more than half the funding was donated by the Diamond A community, as well as \$75k from the Volunteer Association.
- Fire prevention study is continuing. Capt. Johnson is having tremendous success in the
  prevention office, completing over 500 property inspections. The office has also
  completed over 200 first inspections for the County VMI program, as well completed the
  Districts normal VMI for weed abatement issues.

- The fireworks show went off without a hitch and was well received by the community
- Our out of county assignments have begun. Water Tender 3392 returned from the Lava Fire last week. Engine 3361 and 3362 with utilities 3314 and 3342, were deployed to the River Fire early this morning.
- Peter VanFleet gave a brief update on Stn 5: Permit applications have been submitted and should be available soon. Still have the issue with Title 22, but is sure we can get through it.

#### 10. Old Business

a) Director Brady motioned to approve the funding of a new Battalion 3 command vehicle in FY 21/22. M/S/P Brady/Leen with 7 ayes

#### 11. New Business

- a) Director Leen motioned to accept the FY 19/21 Glen Ellen Fire Protection District financial audit. M/S/P Leen/Johnson, 7 ayes
- b) Director Leen motioned to approve the fund balance allocation based on the Valley of the Moon FY 19/20 audit report. **M/S/P Leen/Norton, 7 ayes**
- c) Director Leen motioned to approve Resolution 2021/2022-01, accepting over \$98,000 in grant funding from County of Sonoma to implement the SVFD Curbside Chipper Program.

  M/S/P Leen/Brady, 7 ayes
- d) Director Norton motioned to approve Resolution 2021/2022-02, declaring the SVFD Proposition 4 limits for FY 21/22. **M/SP Norton/Brady, 7 ayes**
- e) Director Brunton motioned to set the SVFD's special tax at 85% of the maximum (\$200) with a 4.19% inflation rate to be levied on each parcel of real property in the SVFD during the FY 21/22. **M/S/P Brunton/Johnson, 7 ayes**
- f) Director Johnson motioned to approve the contract with Hi-Tech Fire Apparatus for the purchase of a new Type 3 fire engine to replace 3376 in the amount of \$463,209.62. **M/S/P Johnson/Brunton, 7 ayes**

Resolution 2021/2022-04 adopting the final District budget for fiscal year 2021/22

#### **Recommended Actions**

Approve 2021/22 final budget

#### **Executive Summary**

Chief Akre will present the FY 2021/22 final budget of the new Sonoma Valley Fire District to the Board. The Board is asked to adopt the final District budget.

Some key features to acknowledge in this year's budget are:

- In our continued effort to obtain autonomy and establish our accounting/finance department we are moving to one budget (799) and have allocated the SVFRA city contract appropriately. The City's share (57%) is now recognized as a revenue and the expenses are allocated within their proper categories.
- In conjunction with moving to one budget and to further establish autonomy from the City we have budgeted for new software implementation. We recognize this as a critical need and imperative for our Districts' growth and best practice standards.
- The budget presented reflects the Board approved special tax revenue that passed at 85% which includes the required inflation component.
- With SAFER grant money @ 75% reimbursement for FY21/22 this allows us to complete one-time projects that are necessary to further establish our new District as Sonoma Valley Fire District. This includes new signage at our district stations. In addition to new signage, it includes station #3 remodel to the offices to allow for enhanced training facilities and opportunities.

The Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000 (Public Law 106-390) established new requirements for pre- and post-disaster hazard mitigation programs. The Sonoma Valley Fire District along with county partners, stakeholders and public engagement developed a mitigation plan with strategies for pro-active mitigation.

The Sonoma County Multijurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan ("MJHMP") is a countywide plan that identifies risks and ways to minimize damage by natural disasters. The plan increases public awareness, helps comply with State and Federal program requirements, and enhances local policies and co-ordination.
