#### **Agenda Item Title**

Renewal of Joint and Mutual Fire Protection and Emergency Medical Services Agreement between the District and the City of Sonoma

#### **Recommended Actions**

#### **Executive Summary**

In December, 2011, the City of Sonoma entered into a Joint and Mutual Fire Protection and Emergency Medical Services Agreement (Service Agreement) for the provision of all-risk emergency services, including fire and emergency medical services, with the Valley of the Moon Fire District. The initial term of that agreement was 5 years beginning on February 2, 2012. The Service Agreement requires that the City provide six months' notice of its desire to renew the agreement for additional five-year periods. Once the Board of Directors receives notice in writing of the City's desire to renew this agreement, the Board shall provide the City Council with written notification of acceptance of renewal for an additional five-year period within thirty (30) days.

### Sonoma Valley Fire & Rescue Authority

#### **Job Summary**

The Sonoma Valley Fire Rescue Authority, Fire Cadet Program is designed to develop future firefighter candidates and to help them to reach their ultimate career goals. Through a process of continuing education, working with fire service personnel, and on the job training opportunities, interested candidates should be able to bring themselves closer to a goal of a fire service career.

#### **Major Duties**

- Supports the day-to-day operations of the Fire Department, through a variety of assignments, some part of a daily routine and others performed as the need arises.
- May be assigned to work in any division of the Fire Department: Administration, Fire Prevention, Fire Suppression, Emergency Medical.
- Assignments may be of short or long duration, with a Cadet working in several different areas within a single day. Assignments might include: assisting with vehicle and equipment maintenance, assisting with training classes and drills; helping with papers, props, visual aides, etc; assisting Fire Prevention Bureau personnel with public education presentations; picking up parts, supplies, and equipment from vendors and retailers; answering phones, receiving the public at the front desk; performing clerical functions, such as copying, filing and general office work; and any other reasonable task that supervisors might assign.
- Cadets will have an assigned day of the week that they will work. They will work a minimum of 1 hour per assigned day and no longer than 3 hours.
- Cadets may ride on apparatus to calls for service in the District, however they are
  restricted strictly to observing the on duty crew operating from inside the apparatus. At no
  time may they exit the vehicle until they return to quarters, unless the Captain deems the
  situation a learning experience at which time the Cadet must be under the direct control
  of the Captain.

#### Minimum Qualifications

- Must possess a valid California driver's license.
- Must currently be enrolled in High School or Junior College.
- Must maintain at least a 2.5 Grade Point Average.
- Must be at least 16 years old upon appointment as a Fire Cadet.
- Must complete HIPPA training
- Must complete and pass a CPR course
- Must not have a criminal record
- Must have a signed Parental Consent Form
