Ordinance Number: 2015/2016-01 Dated: December 8, 2015

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE VALLEY OF THE MOON FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT REVISING THE SCHEDULE OF FEES FOR THE DISTRICT TO COVER THE COSTS OF PROVIDING SERVICES, ISSUING PERMITS, AND ENFORCING REGULATIONS WITHIN THE DISTRICT

The Board of Directors of the Valley of the Moon Fire Protection District ordains as follows:

SECTION I. Schedule of Fees

The 2016 Fee Schedule attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference, is hereby adopted to cover the costs of providing services, issuing permits, and enforcing regulations within the District.

SECTION II. Collection of Fees

The fees provided for in this ordinance may be collected by employees of the District.

SECTION III. Repeal of conflicting ordinances and resolutions

All former ordinances and resolutions of the District or parts thereof conflicting or inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance, including, but not limited to Ordinance 2014/2015-02, are hereby repealed.

SECTION IV. Severability

If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portion of the ordinance. The Board of Directors hereby declares that it would have passed this ordinance and every section, subsection, clause or phrase thereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, sentences, clauses or phrases be declared unconstitutional or invalid.

SECTION V. Effective date

This ordinance shall be and the same is hereby declared to be in full force and effect from and after thirty (30) days after the date of its passage and shall be published once before the expiration of fifteen (15) days after said passage, with the name of the directors voting for and against the same, in the Sonoma Index-Tribune, a newspaper of general circulation published within the County of Sonoma, State of California.
