#### Sonoma Valley Fire and Rescue Authority Apprentice Firefighter

#### **SUMMARY**

Under direction from higher level supervisory and management staff, apprentice firefighters participate in fire suppression, prevention, training and rescue activities in protecting life, property and the environment, and provide basic life support care in response to medical emergencies. Apprentice firefighters certified as Paramedics provide advanced life support care as needed and are subject to the Sonoma Valley Fire and Rescue Authority job specifications for Paramedic.

All public employees are determined to be disaster service workers under Section 3101 of Government Code. As a disaster service worker, this position is subject to such disaster service activities as may be assigned by superiors and subject to mandatory emergency call out.

**ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES** include the following. Other duties may be assigned.

Respond to emergencies and calls for assistance, participating with other team members.

Drive and operate all fire apparatus and equipment; respond to rescue calls as part of an engine company and administer medical care; operate a variety of tools and equipment related to fire suppression, rescue and hazardous materials emergency activities.

Serve as pump operator in firefighting situations including laying hose lines, operating pump and regulating water pressure through hose lines.

Participate in overhaul and salvage operations; inspect and perform routine maintenance on station facilities, fire hydrants and rescue equipment.

Participate in continuous training in fire suppression, prevention, inspection and medical assistance through both simulated and on-the-job exercises.

Inspect commercial, residential and other occupancies for fire hazards and compliance with fire prevention codes and ordinances; conduct fire prevention and education programs.

Operate communication equipment; learn and study Fire Department rules and regulations, fire hazards and firefighting techniques, and related subjects.

Prepare reports, and equipment records; receive and process reports from citizens; observe and report violations of laws and ordinances.

Respond to emergency medical incidents, supervising patient care until relieved by higher medical authority.

Provide emergency and non-emergency medical transportation services, including interfacility transfers.

#### **QUALIFICATIONS**

To perform this job successfully, an individual must be able to perform each essential duty satisfactorily. The requirements listed below are representative of the knowledge, skill, and/or ability required. Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform the essential functions.

Knowledge of: Firefighting methods and techniques; First-Responder medical aid and CPR life saving procedures; operating and mechanical principles of fire apparatus and equipment; principles of mechanics, hydraulics and mathematics as related to firefighting duties; principles, practices and procedures of Basic Life Support; principles of pharmacology and toxicology.

Ability to: Learn rules, regulations and operational procedures of the Fire Department; demonstrate a high degree of mechanical aptitude; learn to drive and operate effectively and safely the full range of fire apparatus and equipment used by the department; learn the street location and physical layout of the District, City and surrounding communities; think and act quickly in emergencies; work effectively as a member of a team; understand and follow oral and written directions promptly and accurately; communicate orally effectively to individuals or in a group setting learn through structured lectures in an classroom setting and through oral instruction in an on-the-job setting; comprehend and make inferences from written material; learn to operate and enter data into a computer terminal; produce written documents using proper English grammar and punctuation; deal courteously and effectively with the public; establish and maintain cooperative relationships with those contacted in the course of work.

Sonoma LAFCO Fiscal Year 2017-18 Proposed Budget

At its meeting on April 12, 2017, the Sonoma Local Agency Formation Commission ("Commission") adopted a 2017-18 Proposed Budget after a noticed public hearing. The Commission's consideration of the 2017-18 Final Budget will take place on June 7, 2017, after a public hearing, as required by state law. The new budget will become effective on July 1, 2017.

The Proposed Budget projects approximately \$625,800 in expenditures, a slight decrease from the current-year budget of \$626,055.

Sonoma LAFCO and the County of Sonoma maintain a Memorandum of Understanding which covers staffing and operational requirements for the Commission; staff are County employees but work only for LAFCO. The Proposed Budget will cover the cost of salaries and benefits for the same level of staffing as in the current year; these costs are anticipated to increase by less than two percent. The cost of services and supplies to support LAFCO operations is expected to decrease by more than five percent.

The Commission is funded primarily by apportionments from the County, the cities, and the independent special districts. In the 2017-18 Proposed Budget, apportionments are projected to increase, overall, by just two-thirds of one percent. Individual agency apportionments, most likely based on revenues reported to the State Controller's Office for Fiscal Year 2014-15, can vary from year to year. Apportionment information will be provided when the data becomes available, typically at the end of May or beginning of June. The Commission also receives revenue from processing fees. Finally, a minimal amount accrues from interest in invested funds.

The Commission's reserve, or fund balance, designated to meet unbudgeted needs; is anticipated to increase next year. At the Commission's direction, LAFCO staff will meet soon with members of the LAFCO Policy Committee and Budget Committee to discuss plans for the use of the fund balance; this could include allocation for consultant services for needed studies, legal and administrative reserve, undesignated contingency, and credit to funding agencies. Upon recommendation of its committees, the Commission will determine its policy on reserves.

#### Dear To Whom It May Concern:

Our office is notifying you, as required by Section 10404 of the Elections Code, that a special district has submitted a resolution to the Board of Supervisors to change their regularly scheduled elections for governing board members from odd-numbered years to even-numbered years. The North Sonoma Coast Fire Protection District has adopted a resolution to move to even-numbered elections in November 2018, thereby extending the terms of office of all current Board members by one year.

Copies of the resolutions from the above-named special district requesting the change, are available for review in the Clerk of the Board Office. The Sonoma County Registrar of Voters will be advising the Board of Supervisors that it will be able to facilitate the requested changes.

However, you are <u>not required</u> to submit input. Comments on the plans submitted by the above-named special districts can be presented at the May 23, 2017 Board of Supervisors' meeting, or written comments may be submitted to the Clerk of the Board, to be received no later than 12:00 p.m. on Monday, May 22, 2017.
